Nomination deadline

Winter semester and whole year: 31st May

Summer semester: 31st October

Application process

A sending institution nominates its students via e-mail for a study period/traineeship. Application instructions will be e-mailed to all nominated students along with the access to the online registration system (USOS). Both sending and receiving institution approve the Learning Agreement (LA) and Student Application (SA). Students will receive information concerning further procedure and courses in English available for incoming students after the application deadline.

Visa

Temporary residence permit EU citizens

Citizens of European Union Member Countries can enter Polish territory based on having a valid travel document (passport/ID card). Requirements for a temporary residence permit for EU citizens:

Third-country citizens (non-EU)

Non-EU citizens are entitled to enter Polish territory based on having:

- valid travel document,
- visa, if it is required, justified purpose and conditions of their intended stay and proof they have sufficient means of subsistence for the planned stay and a return journey to their country of origin or that they are capable of obtaining such means lawfully, appropriate health insurance.

Student accommodation

Students who provide necessary application documents can apply for an accommodation at one of the Student Dormitories of the University of Physical Education in Krakow. The double rooms are a standard. If student applies to have own room student should pay double deposit and double rent. Such an option is possible only in case of **availability of places**.

Language requirements

The standard language proficiency required is English, B1.
