6) Syllabus:

This will be an introductory course giving the basis of tourism studies. Topics of both lectures and classes include:

Definitions and classifications of tourism, recreation, and leisure.

A brief history of travel and tourism.

Forms of contemporary tourism. Tourist typologies and experiences.

International and domestic tourism in numbers (UN WTO, EUROSTAT statistics).

Top tourist destinations in Poland and Central-Eastern Europe.

Cultural heritage sites in Poland (UNESCO World Heritage List).

Impact of tourism – case studies.

Ethics of tourism : The Global Ethic Code for Tourism (UNWTO, 1999).

Sustainable tourism development – principles and challenges.

7) Students will learn about different forms of contemporary tourism and the most attractive tourist sites and trails in Poland and Central-Eastern Europe. On the basis of case studies, they will analyze impacts of international and domestic tourism on nature, cultural heritage and local community of a destination. Taking into account relations between tourism, leisure and recreational physical activity, they will learn about new forms of tourism.
